COMPACT has submitted a formal request to the AR Child Care Facility Review Board, for an Emergency Residential Child Care License, and is scheduled to appear for the board meeting on May 27, 2020. COMPACT is currently licensed as a Residential Child Care Facility (see attached license) and fully expects to be approved for an Emergency Residential Child Care License. 	5 points
B. Describe your experience in providing the specialized services mentioned in the Scope of Work. COMPACT's ability to admit residents on an emergency basis, was successfully exercised during the period of time we held a Respite contract. 24-hour and on-call services are aspects of our residential program, therefore, resuming a 24-hour emergency response element to the existing structure will be straight forward.	5 points
COMPACT already functions with around-the-clock staff and will be prepared to enhance this functionality with the award of this new contract. Through current and prior contracts, we have served residents that meet diagnoses of developmental disability and pervasive developmental disorder. All direct care staff receive 3 weeks of training to instruct on TBRI principles and address the potential need for restraints, through Handle with Care training, to protect a resident from harm to self or others. Additional specialized training will be developed and derived from local supports and resources such as Kid Source, Lakeside School District Special Ed and services, and Arkansas Counseling and Psychodiagnostics. Campus medical and case management services will receive additional training as well to improve our ability to deliver services to this special population.	
Regarding individually tailored services, our TBRI model of care provides our staff with behavioral shaping and management skills. Local access to First Step and Kid Source provides COMPACT with additional support to address reinforcement of therapeutic services, communication, mobility, behavioral shaping and management, socialization, and daily living skills. Socialization will also be enhanced through campus activities, community involvement, and educational services at Lakeside School District. Daily living skills have been provided both on campus and by Lakeside School District. COMPACT would be prepared to further develop and train staff to address the complex needs this population may present.	
Our current program provides 24/7 resident supervision, on-call case management services, and on-call crisis intervention through Arkansas Counseling and Psychodiagnostics. Our cottages are currently able to hold 4 or more residents.

Hillcrest Children's Home, 2325 Malvern Ave, Hot Springs, AR 71901. 39 miles from the Pulaski County line. The campus is located on 52 acres to include indoor pool, large gymnasium, outdoor play space, swings, and ball field.

Trained staff will be prepared to answer questions and initiate admission procedures, based on bed availability. Beyond the basic training designed for our general population and QRTP residents, DDS staff will be provided additional trainings to include TBRI for Autism Spectrum Disorder, behavioral management for special needs, sanitation training, hygiene care, CPR and First Aid, food handling, nutrition, and safety.	5 points

Our Residential Director, LaDana, has a master's degree in Special Ed and master's in Psychology. She has had 20 plus year of experience working with children and youth with developmental disabilities. Our trainer, Joyce, is an experienced TBRI trainer and has an education degree and background. Our proposed House Manager would include Devon who has an Occupational Therapy degree. Our proposed case manager, Brian S., has a background of 20 plus years working in education. Our administrator, Brian P., is a Licensed Clinical Social Worker. See attachment. LaDana, Joyce, Devon, Brian S., and Brian P. 	5 points
 D. Describe how you will ensure the availability of staff and services twenty-four (24) hours a day seven (7) days a week. House Managers will live in the adjoining apartment and be able to provide immediate 24/7 support. Their adjoining residence will provide a more family like setting for the residents. Shift workers will be present and awake around-the-clock daily. Additional case management support will be on-call 24/7. 	5 points
 E. Describe Bidder's approach to providing services to the Developmental Disability population in a separate building from any other placement programs Bidder may operate. COMPACT has identified a cottage (building) that will be solely dedicated to this program. The building will offer individual bedrooms, a sensory room, a kitchen, a dining room, a living room, laundry facilities, and office space for staff and professional personnel. Outdoor space for games, activities, and socialization with other youth, as appropriate, is available and at a safe distance from public roads. 	5 points




